About The Project

The project is located in the highlands of the islands of Galapagos. The aim of the project is to develop reforestation and technology to reconstruct native habitats on the island, and for it to then serve as a center for similar projects in the highlands of other populated islands of the Galapagos. Currently there is very limited remaining native species due to farming activities and the introduction of invasive species. The project has also established a Plant Conservation Center for native plant species.

The project also works with local landowners to develop clean agricultural alternatives for fruit and vegetable production, which they then sell to local universities, restaurants and hotels.

Volunteer Role

The first Monday at the Academia is an orientation day. All new students and volunteers go on a city tour of Quito. In the afternoon there's an information session in which you will learn about the Academia, as well as about important issues such as security, do's and don'ts in Ecuador, accommodation, volunteer work etc. Volunteers then usually fly to the Galapagos on the Wednesday.



As a volunteer you will be involved in some or all of the following activities;

- Reforestation – collecting and classifying seeds, working in the nursery, planting native species, maintaining reforestation lines.
- Providing environmental education to local people and schools.
- Station maintenance – maintaining trails, making signs for the trails, basic construction work, helping in the kitchen.
- Organic agricultural activities – helping to maintain and secure food production for the station.

You will also be taken on guided hikes through the reserve and surrounding area to lagoons, forests, beaches and villages and learn about the biodiversity, natural history and ecology.

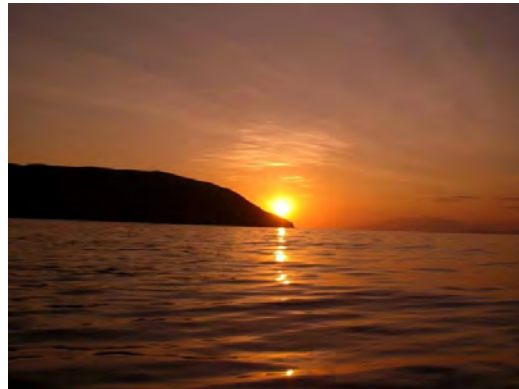


Occasionally you may be required to work a half-day on Saturdays, but you will have free time the rest of the weekend to spend as you wish. The Galapagos is a nature lovers dream! You will be able to spend time spotting rare bird species such as the red footed booby, hanging out with sea lions on the beach, meeting the Galapagos Giant Tortoise, snorkeling with the incredible marine life and trying your hand at a spot of surfing!

Location

The project is located in one of the oldest island in the Galapagos archipelago. The flora and fauna on the island is simply breathtaking. It is home to frigate birds, sea lions, blue and red footed boobies, iguanas, dolphins, sharks, rays and more! It is a two-hour flight from Quito to the Galapagos, and all flights go via Guyaquil.

The Galapagos is inhabited by 40,000 people, living in just eight main settlements on four of the islands. In the center of the archipelago lies Santa Cruz, to the east is San Cristobal, straddling the equator to the west of Santa Cruz is Isabela, and in the south is Floreana. Just 3% of the Galapagos is inhabited – the rest is protected by National Park status and has been since 1959 due to damaged caused to flora and fauna by human interference. Visitors are restricted to the colonized areas as well as over sixty designated visitor sites spread across the islands. By volunteering on this project, you will gain a unique insight into life on the Galapagos.



Accommodation

You will live with other volunteers in rustic accommodation on the island. You will have shared bedrooms and bathroom facilities (cold water showers). Three meals per day are provided, consisting of typical Ecuadorian cuisine.

Requirements

Volunteers must be able to commit to at least 4 weeks at the. When choosing to volunteer in a developing country such as Ecuador, it is important to remain flexible as the needs of the project are constantly evolving. This is what makes volunteering so rewarding – the fact that you are on hand to lend your support when and where it is needed.
